### **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**



One of the questions that we on the board get on a regular basis is: "When will we get a neighborhood grocery store." We (SMCC Board) have been attempting to get a grocery store for some time but cannot seem to attract a taker. Perhaps it is time to reach out to the neighborhood to see if they know anyone who would be willing to do so. It seems to me that we would support such an endeavor wholeheartedly as a neighborhood. The answers we have been given so far are that the logistics do not support a major endeavor such as Vons's, or Ralph's because of density or population that the store would draw. At one time we were talking to a Fresh and Easy but they were not able to secure a location and were going to locate in Mission Valley but I do not believe that has happened either. Other questions we hear often are: "When can we expect some new buildings on the vacant sites we have at Ruffin and Mission Village Drive, or Shaun and Mission Village Drive?" All of them were gas stations and there is still mitigation going on relative to leaks from the gasoline storage tanks. We also have to understand that these are private sites owned by persons who have not elected to build and there is not much we can do about that. I know it is as frustrating for you as it is for us.

At our last Serra Mesa General meeting, we had as our speakers members from the Alliance Realty Partners team who will be constructing Broadstone Kearny/ Mesa. This property is located on the southwest Corner of Sandrock Rd.and Aero Dr. We saw some of the preliminary plans that gave us some idea of the scope and look of this building. There is currently a fence around the property and we can expect construction of this project for the next 2 years. If you are unaware of the project, the right turn lane or "porkchop" as many of us refer to it will eliminated.

If you have a desire to get involved in our Planning Group, I have been informed that they have openings for a few good men and women. Their job is to review and communicate future construction and traffic plans with the City of San Diego. They generally meet on the 3rd Thursday at the SM/KM Library on Aero Drive. If you have a heart and desire to get involved, I am sure there is room for your thoughts and ideas.

We are also opening up our Recreational Center Meeting which meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at the Serra Mesa Recreation Center. If your passion is for recreation and what is happening there, this is a great place to get involved. We have wonderful programs that are available for everyone and I encourage you to get involved to support this program. The Recreation Center is located at 9020 Village Glen Drive.

If you haven't noticed, we have a lot going on at the Library. Just some of the activities include music programs, reading programs, adult programs, and children programs. You can join "Friends of Serra Mesa – Kearny Mesa Library" who are constantly looking for ways to improve our services and access to great reading materials. If you haven't noticed, we constantly have great books for sale at incredibly low prices. Help the library and get a deal as well.

Finally, I would urge you to join our work groups at our "Friends of Ruffin Canyon Cleanup" group. In addition to working with our Canyon Ranger, they are also responsible for the planting of trees which align Sandrock Rd. and the canyon as well as Sandrock Rd. and Greyling Ave. We can thank our local dentist, Dr. Joe Sparrow, for providing irrigation to the young Cork Oaks which will become home to woodpeckers as well as providing beauty for our neighborhood. Take a look when in the area and enjoy this section of Serra Mesa.

Well, as you can see, we have lots to be thankful for here in Serra Mesa. It just doesn't happen by itself. Are you in possession of some free time that you can donate to our neighborhood? I hope I have provided you with some suggestions which will draw you into helping design our "hood" for the future.

### Kearny International Business gets Academic Achievement Award

Kearny High School of International Business has received the 2012-13 Title I Academic Achievement Award from the California Department of Education.

The school must be part of the federal Title I program, which helps students who live in communities where families are classified as low-income, and show sustained progress in academic improvement among low-income students.

This is the second honor in a week for the Kearny School of International Business. On Thursday, the school was named a California Distinguished School for 2013. A list of previous district schools receiving the award is available at www.sandi.net.

"The students at Kearny International Business have shown continuing improvement in their academic achievements," said Superintendent Bill Kowba. "The hard work by the principal, teachers and staff, and the students has resulted in these important recognitions."

According to the California Department of Education, the school must demonstrate that all students are making significant progress toward proficiency on California's academic content standards. Additionally, the school's socioeconomically disadvantaged students must have doubled the achievement targets set for them for two consecutive years.

"These schools serve students facing real challenges, and they've risen to meet them through hard work and dedication," California Superintendent Torlakson said. "It is inspiring to see their students achieve more in the classroom today so they can enjoy more opportunity in the years to come."

#### Congratulations to Kearny International Business: they're 'Distinguished'

The School of International Business at the Kearny High Educational Complex is a California Distinguished School for the second time in four years. The 2013 list was released Thursday by the California Department of Education.

The state makes the awards to middle and high schools on odd-numbered years, elementary schools on even-numbered years. For a list of past San Diego Unified winners go to the district's Awards and Distinctions section on their website at www.sandi.net.

"Each of the students, principal, staff, parents, volunteers and the entire school community should be saluted for excellent work," said Superintendent Bill Kowba. "This is exciting news for each of these campuses."

The 2013 California Distinguished Schools Program directly focuses on the right of California's students to an equitable and rigorous education, and recognizes those schools that have made progress in narrowing the academic achievement gap, according to State Superintendent Tom Torlakson.

"These schools have gone the extra mile to provide high-quality instruction that puts their students on the right path toward career and college," Torlakson said. "Given the enormous challenges schools have faced in recent years, it is inspiring to see this kind of success in so many schools. Our future depends on meeting the needs of every student no matter where they come from or where they live."

To apply for Distinguished School honors, schools must meet a variety of eligibility criteria, including accountability measures. Once schools are deemed eligible, the California Department of Education (CDE) invites them to apply to be recognized as a California Distinguished School.

The application process consists of a written application, which includes a comprehensive description of two of the school's signature practices, and a county-led site validation review process, which validates the implementation of those signature practices.

### **Cubberley Robotics Team**

Our "Metal Bots" Robotics Team has had a great year of learning. It has been a journey getting the team off the ground; we could not have done this without our devoted volunteers, mentors, and coaches who have given generously of their effort, determination, and time to our students. The Metal Bots have worked hard to fundraise and also seek grants to support the program. Most recently our team was awarded a grant from the **Women in Defense**. We are most grateful for the support provided by them. Team

> members are also learning how robotics relates in the world. Guest speaker, Dr. Richard Coutts, orthopedic surgeon with Sharp Health Care introduced robotic knee surgery to our students. Guest speaker engineer, Alex Dowell with Sea Botix spoke to the students regarding his work with underwater robots. We know that our students are our future doctors, engineers, and scientists!!

The team went on a field trip to LEGOLAND to learn about programming the Mind Storms robot

in January. With weekly meetings, mentors and volunteers have guided students to build and program our robots to perform missions. The team participated in 3 tournaments this year with the Spring Showdown and Lego Yard Wars at LEGOLAND and another at Grossmont College. With each tournament the Metal Bots have gained experience and have improved immensely after each one. In the last tournament at LEGOLAND in March, the team scored 68 of the 70 points in the **On the Spot Challenge**, the only elementary school to complete it. For this part of the challenges no coaches or adults were allowed when each team was given a new mission to complete.

# **SERRA MESA PLANNING GROUP NEWS**

The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG is responsible for

- Reviewing development projects proposed for Serra Mesa focusing on conformance with our community plan
- Reviewing development projects for the areas surrounding Serra Mesa to ensure that impacts are addressed
- Monitoring redevelopment projects for proposed rezoning in Serra Mesa to ensure that impacts are addressed

Elected members are Jim Baldrica, Bob McDowell, Dicken Hall, Matt Hendry, Mark Larsen, Cindy Moore, Barbara Ryan, Brad Savall, and Tom Wright. Elected officers are Cindy Moore, Chair; Bob McDowell, Vice-Chair, and Brad Savall, Secretary. There are three vacancies which SMPG needs to fill to remain in good standing. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two SMPG meetings is eligible to be elected.

SMPG's role is important and crucial to the well-being of Serra Mesa. SMPG was inactive from the mid-1980's-early 1990's. During that time boundary adjustments were made which have greatly impacted Serra Mesa. At one time the site of the Civita project and the Kearny Mesa area were part of the Serra Mesa planning area and included in our community plan. SMPG needs to remain active!

If you have an interest or an expertise in areas related to building, landscaping, environment, or planning, SMPG needs you. The City provides training. See http://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources/ cow/index.shtml.

#### **Reporting Graffiti**

If you see graffiti vandalism in progress, call **911** and report it immediately to the San Diego Police Department. Do not confront the vandals. Although they may appear to be harmless, they may be carrying weapons. The police will respond based on the priority of the crime compared to others for which they have calls at the time.

#### **Reporting Existing Graffiti**

If you see graffiti in your neighborhood on public or private property, report it immediately to the Graffiti Control Program through the online reporting form or by calling the Graffiti Hotline at (619) 525-8522. Calls to the Graffiti Hotline are confidential.

City crews remove graffiti from city property, usually within four days of receiving a report. City code compliance officers must notify private property owners of graffiti on their property and of their responsibility to remove it. Depending on the cooperation of property owners, it could take longer for graffiti to be removed from private properties.

#### **Rewards Program**

With our Spray and Pay Graffiti Rewards Program, you could receive up to \$500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of graffiti vandals.

#### How the Program Works

The City's Spray and Pay Rewards Program rewards citizens up to \$500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of graffiti vandals. Spray and Pay Rewards Program brochures and claim forms are available at San Diego Police Department storefronts and satellite offices or by contacting the Graffiti Control Program hotline at (619) 525-8522. #### Graffiti on Your Property

If you find graffiti on your property, you should remove it immediately. By painting over graffiti as soon as possible, you will discourage further graffiti. Graffiti vandals want to be recognized for their work, and once they realize that their graffiti is removed quickly from a location, they will ultimately move on to other locations. It may take multiple paint-outs to deter the vandals. Be persistent!

#### Strategies for Keeping Property Graffiti Free

Check your local hardware store for special products that can be applied to surfaces, making them graffiti resistant. Install good lighting on the walls and fences that may be vulnerable to graffiti. Plant shrubs or climbing vines to restrict access to graffiti prone areas. And finally, encourage your neighbors to watch for and report graffiti vandals.

#### The City's Paint and Materials Exchange Bank

Contact the city's Paint and Materials Exchange Bank for assistance or questions pertaining to graffiti removal supplies and safety. The City of San Diego operates a Paint and Materials Exchange Bank in the Chollas View area where citizens can obtain free recycled paint in limited colors for graffiti removal. Call the paint bank at (619) 527-5419 to make an appointment for pick up of paint and supplies or submit the on-line Release of City of San Diego Materials Form.

You can also call Project CLEAN at (619) 563-4014 for assistance regarding strategies and tactics for graffiti removal, paint selection, etc.

The role of the Serra Mesa Enhancement Committee (SMEC) is to provide information, education, cooperation, and assistance in the area of City Code Compliance. After confirming a code violation SMEC sends a friendly, educational letter asking for compliance. In 90% of the cases people come into compliance and cases are not reported to the City. If you have a problem in your area, report the problem with this confidential form.
