Awestruck in Serra Mesa

"Awe is the feeling of being in the presence of something vast or beyond human scale, that transcends our current understanding of things," says psychologist Dacher Kelner, University of California Berkeley's Social Interaction Lab. The article, AWE – Feeling AWE May Be The Secret To Health And Happiness in the October 9 Parade magazine, discusses the power of Awe. Discoveries include Awe binds us together, helps us see things in new ways, makes us nicer and happier, and alters our bodies. Nature is mentioned as an example of an awe experience.

Reading this article reminded me of how fortunate we are in Serra Mesa to have access to numerous parks (Murray Ridge; Cabrillo Heights; Bonnie Hough Nature Habitat Garden; Wegeforth, Juarez, Fletcher and soon to open Angier Joint Use), and trails (path from recreation center to library, Sandrock Canyon, Ruffin Canyon, Shawn Canyon, and Murray Canyon).

Walk along a busy, noisy Serra Mesa street and then take a walk in one of our canyons. What an awe experience to be surrounded by the beauty and sounds of nature! The Friends of Ruffin Canyon is knowledgeable about the canyon trails. This group provides restoration work on many of the trails and the habitat garden. WHAT IS THE FUNCTION OF YOUR SERRA MESA PLANNING GROUP?

This is the first in a series of articles designed to help those that live, own property or own a business in the Serra Mesa community understand the workings and the purpose of the Serra Mesa Planning Group.

As with life itself, the Serra Mesa Community changes with time. Some parts of the community are yet to be created while other parts are but a memory. How the community changes is generally regulated by the Community Plan.

Subject to the City of San Diego's General Plan, the Community Plan outlines and regulates what can and cannot be built in the community and includes features such as height, use (commercial, residential, industrial, agriculture, etc.) and setback (distance from the road) among others.

It is also important to understand that the City of San Diego is not always the ultimate authority when it comes to city planning. Like most other communities in the country, Serra Mesa is multi-jurisdictional and is required to consider "overlays" from other authorities such as the County of San Diego, the State of California, the Federal Government, the military, airports, canyons and waterways, endangered plant life, wildlife zones and others. In addition, although not much of a factor in Serra Mesa, City Planning is also required to deal with mountains, the Pacific Ocean and our border with Mexico.

So, what happens when someone wants to change something either by building something new or repurposing an existing structure? First of all, it is important to understand that there are two basic types of projects: "ministerial" and "discretionary".

A project that is ministerial is in full compliance with the community plan and is built "by right". Although it is was not required for this type of project to be reviewed by a community planning group, it is not unusual for project managers of ministerial projects to present their project to the planning group to let everyone know what is happening in the community.

A discretionary project does NOT comply with the community plan and IS required to appear before the community planning group. At the end of the presentation, the community planning group may request more information, vote to recommend approval of the project by city planning or vote to not recommend approval of the project by city planning. If the community planning group votes against recommending approval, the specific reasons for not recommending approval are given to the city planning department to help them determine their final decision.

Although not typically required, the Serra Mesa Planning Group is often presented with other information such as:

- Future discretionary projects. This helps the architect receive community input to assist in the design of a project in order to obtain approval later.
- Discretionary projects in neighboring communities. Planning groups often work together for the common good and, when a discretionary project may have some effect on a neighboring community, it is common that a planning group or city staff will request the opinion of a neighboring planning group.
- Future non-specific plans. Government agencies and elected officials or their representatives often request community support for future projects or proposals. Although not technically discretionary issues, these projects or proposals could result in issues that affect community plans.

Home and community-based services can support individuals to age in place, yet it can be a challenge to find safe, quality services to meet one's full range of evolving needs. This innovative community-based program provides a one-stop, trusted resource that enables people to live safely and well at home for as long as possible.

For more than a decade, the "Village" model has demonstrated that older adults are willing to invest in a membership program that offers access to an array of vetted service providers, focused social and educational programs, organized community volunteers, and the convenience of a knowledgeable resource to assist them in finding and coordinating services.

The "village" model has caught on nationally and even internationally. Numerous articles and publications (Forbes Magazine, AARP Magazine, New York Times to name a few have promoted it as an aging strategy for the future. The first west coast village was launched in the Palo Alto area in 2008. Since then, villages have developed in several California communities including Serra Mesa.

Today, a national Village-to -Village Network enables developing and operational villages to share knowledge and resources. To learn more about village's national and globally, visit www.vtnetwork.org.

Serra Mesa is unique among communities in that they have a "Village" which is composed of residents in Serra Mesa who are interested in interacting with other persons who are seniors. The major purpose of the Village is to give purpose and meaning to those unwilling to just sit around and age. Franklin Ridge Road Connection Update

A Draft Program Environmental Impact Report (DPEIR) was prepared for a Serra Mesa Community Plan amendment to allow a four-lane Franklin Ridge Road extension from Civita in Mission Valley to Phyllis Place (across from City View Church) in Serra Mesa. The City received 182 letters of response to the DPEIR.

The City's project manager in late September 2016 indicated that the City has decided to revise the environmental document and recirculate it. Once it's recirculated, the public has 60 days to respond. The recirculation date is unknown.

Farewell Serra Mesa!

I had lived in San Diego (San Carlos) for 11 years in 1995 when my Bishop said he was giving my name as a possible pastor to Gethsemane in Serra Mesa. Since I had never been in the neighborhood, I came and explored (including an ice cream at Thrifty's!). I found the Library on Sandrock (similar to the one in Allied Gardens) and a copy of the Observer with its "Home of the Month" on the cover. I accepted Gethsemane's call and started on January 1, 1996. Now, I am retiring after 21 years and want to wish Serra Mesa well and share a few memories and tributes.

In my time here, there have been dedicated leaders for the Serra Mesa Community Council...Peggy, Les, and Carl along with all the Board members. I was invited to serve on the Board about 15 years ago and met great people and learned so much in this experience. I adopted "Education" and worked with the Kearny Cluster to improve the networking of and respect for the schools in Serra Mesa. Taft Middle does not deserve to be hindered by old stories... go and visit now and see how the students are being prepared for the possibilities of Kearny High/Mesa College. (If you did not know it, Serra Mesa has Pre-K through 14 system because of the Kearny/Mesa partnership.) The Community Fairs were great, becoming so successful that volunteers could not sustain it. The movies, concerts and Farmers Market are wonderful ways now to gather as a community.

The Planning Group has a tough task since Serra Mesa is bounded on the north and south by the most commercial areas of Kearny Mesa and Mission Valley. It too has had amazing leaders, especially Cindy Moore. The effort she led to keep development on Aero Drive "right sized" was outstanding. Friends of Ruffin Canyon stands out as a small but hearty group, led for years by the late Bonnie Hough and Monica Fuentes. The monthly work parties in partnership with the Canyonlands division of San Diego Park and Recreation has made a real difference in Shawn Canyon, Gethsemane's back yard. It was our joy to sponsor the 4th of July "Come for Breakfast and Take a Hike" to introduce the canyons to more residents.

Our partnership with Mission Village Christian Fellowship to start the Serra Mesa Food Pantry and the Serra Mesa Community Garden & Orchard has been very rewarding. When the San Diego Food Bank approached Brenda Casey of MVCF with seed money to begin a community garden, we "discovered" unused land at the back of our lots. The garden and orchard produce fresh fruits and vegetables for the pantry and for individuals through the work of amazing leaders including Karl Doering, Coni Fiss, Bev Latham, Carl Demas, and more. These "urban farmers" put this North Dakota farm girl to shame!

The latest venture, the Serra Mesa Village, a neighborly network of seniors for seniors, is on its way to strengthen Serra Mesa after two years. Most communities become "unplanned" retirement communities and the residents who desire to stay put and age in place need to connect with others. Look for this group to continue to make an impact to making Serra Mesa even better!

I am very proud that we have been able to renew our front sign area on Melbourne and highlight the three olive trees that were planted when Gethsemane was begun in the early 1960's. ("Gethsemane" was an opening or garden on

<u>Serra Mesa News</u>

Gateway Sign – As a permit condition Alliance Residential Company, the developer of Broadstone Corsair at the corner of Aero and Sandrock, will provide and maintain a Serra Mesa community sign to be installed in the median on Sandrock Road. At a joint Serra Mesa Community Council and Serra Mesa Planning Group meeting in November 2015, the community provided input for the sign design. The approximate size will be 4 feet tall x 5 feet wide. Alliance's signage consultant is working on the final design.

Taft Joint Use Project – A joint use park on the south side of Taft Middle School, 9191 Gramercy Drive, will be constructed with fees from Broadstone Corsair, the development at the corner of Aero and Sandrock. When school isn't in session the park is open to the general public. Possible amenities for the 4.7-acre project include natural turf sports fields, accessibility upgrades, fitness stations, tennis courts, a track, and a parking lot. There was community interest in adding a small cement stage to the site (e.g., could be used for concerts). In July 2016 the Serra Mesa Park & Recreation Council voted to approve the joint use project concept to include a stage. The next major step in the process is for review and approval by the City of San Diego Park and Recreation Board. The views of Ruffin Canyon and the surrounding area from this park should be awesome!

This website is used by most of the major Serra Mesa community organizations to provide information about their organization and community events. The website will be expanded to include additional community organizations and to improve functionality.
