

***Your Safe Place* brought domestic violence services together under one roof 20 years ago**

Domestic violence rips at the fabric of our families, leaving its survivors feeling ashamed, isolated, and fearful. Those who muster the courage to leave often don't know where to go to get the support they need.

Twenty years ago, victims of domestic violence had to navigate a web of agencies to obtain the essential services. The challenges could be daunting: scheduling a dozen or more appointments, arranging for childcare, taking time off work, finding transportation, and never knowing about the services you might be missing. It was a daunting challenge.

That's when something remarkable happened. A few dedicated San Diegans -- including former City Attorney Casey Gwinn -- recognized how the fragmented system was delaying or even denying the healing that survivors and their families desperately needed. So, they created the world's first Family Justice Center, known today as *Your Safe Place*.

Victims of domestic violence in the City of San Diego now come to one location to meet with an advocate, obtain a restraining order, create a safety plan, meet with a counselor, obtain police reports, receive medical assistance, counsel with a chaplain, get help with transportation and housing, and obtain nutrition and wellness services.

These services, provided by on-site partners, are confidential, free, and offered without judgment to empower clients to move forward with their lives.

The success of San Diego's one-stop shop for domestic violence victims quickly received recognition at the highest levels.

Then-President George W. Bush was so impressed with its success after just one year in operation that the Department of Justice allocated more than \$20 million in grants to establish 15 family justice centers in the United States.

Your Safe Place has only grown in the years since. It now provides services to other vulnerable individuals who are subject to exploitation and abuse: victims of sex trafficking, sexual assault, family violence, and elder abuse.

YSP now works with more than 60 community organizations that generously provide services that include counseling, forensic medical examinations, restraining orders, housing support and financial security, immigration services, and parenting assistance.

Recognizing the extreme risk posed by abusers with guns, *YSP* also protects clients by obtaining Gun Violence Restraining Orders to remove firearms from dangerous situations before a tragedy occurs.

The number of domestic violence incidents remains tragically high. Every hour in America almost 1,200 people report being physically abused by a domestic intimate partner. It's a difficult statistic to even process: almost 1,200 people every hour of every day.

Your Safe Place offers a haven for victims -- a literal safe place where they can come to heal and move forward with their lives.

Over the past two decades, the Family Justice Center movement has spread far and wide. There are now more than 100 Family Justice Centers across the United States as well as centers in more than 20 countries around the world.

Family Justice Centers, like *Your Safe Place*, have been identified as a "best practice" in helping domestic violence victims and their children.

Meetings: The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library and via online meetings. To receive notices about meetings which will include an online link, sign up at <http://www.serramesa.org/>. Next meetings: November 17 and December 15 (only meet if needed). 4 Board Openings: SMPG's bylaws allow fifteen board members. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two SMPG meetings in the last six months is eligible to be elected. The City provides training. See <https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources>. Several people have volunteered to be on the board. The election will be held at the next SMPG meeting.

Agenda for November 15th Meeting: Election for Board Member Openings; Campus Improvement Projects, Rady Children's Hospital; and Unfunded approved stop sign at Greyling and Polland.

2023 Project: In September the City Council passed revisions to Council Policy 600-24 which governs community planning groups. By the end of 2023 all planning groups will be required to apply for recognition and submit the following documents: bylaws, election procedures, operating procedures, ethical standards, and community participation and representation plan. This is a huge project, but necessary if we're to retain a planning group. If there's anyone interested in helping with this endeavor, please contact us.

- **Mission Village Drive Lane Reconfiguration** – The City has approved the reconfiguration of Mission Village Drive. Implementation is planned for fall 2022. For visuals (file received wasn't of the highest quality), refer to <http://www.serramesa.org/hot-topics/>.

Reconfiguration:

- From Friars to Ronda Ave – Redesigned northbound to gradual reduction from two lanes to one lane and installs buffered Class II bike lanes (no physical barrier). Class II bike lanes are defined by pavement striping and signage.
- From Ronda to Ruffin Road – Redesigned to three lanes (two travel lanes and a middle turn lane) and installs buffered Class II bicycle lanes (no physical barrier). This results in the elimination of one travel lane in each direction. At the four way intersections there are left turn lanes.

Franklin Ridge Road Connection Update

The last Observer article listed questions that were asked of staff. Listed below are the questions from the community representative and staff's answers in italics.

Murray Ridge Bridge – The mitigation in the Quarry Falls document stipulates five lanes. The mitigation in the Serra Mesa Community Plan Amendment document stipulates five lanes and bike lanes. A review of the official hearings indicates that the addition of bike lanes to the mitigation was integral to the city council's approval of the project. Staff assured the city council that the Murray Ridge bridge could be configured to two bike lanes and five travel lanes.

- Will bike lanes be included in the Murray Ridge Bridge mitigation?

No bridge widening will take place. Lane striping will be in coordination with Caltrans. With support from the City, the master developer will coordinate with Caltrans to achieve a design exception to Caltrans standards so that bike lanes can be included on the bridge.

Phyllis Place – The mitigation requires that Phyllis Place be widened from Franklin Ridge Road to I-805 SB ramps to accommodate five lanes (three EB and two WB), including a median, and maintain any currently existing bike lanes/ and or any bike lanes included in the Bicycle Master Plan.

- Since the Phyllis Place mitigation isn't included in the Quarry Falls Transportation Phasing Plan, who will be responsible for this mitigation and how will it be funded?

Sudberry Properties will be responsible for implementation of the mitigation.

City View Church Driveway – Driveway shall be relocated as part of the four-way intersection design with the proposed roadway and Phyllis Place.

- Who will be responsible for this mitigation and how is it funded?

Sudberry to fund and construct. The church is in agreement.

- When does the church's CUP expire?

No CUP expiration date was found.

- What effort has been made for potential solutions for traffic hazards?

Roadway improvements will be designed to City and industry standards.

- Does the installation of a Phyllis Place signal create any inconsistency with City Code?

No, there would be no inconsistency with the San Diego Municipal Code.

- If the driveways don't line up and there's a median as indicated in the MMRP [Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program], vehicles exiting from the east driveway, the main one, will be required to turn right. If they wish to go east on Phyllis Place, they will need to make a U-turn, either at the connector traffic signal or within the community.

The main church driveway will be aligned with the new intersection of the extension of Franklin Ridge Road to Phyllis Place to create a full access four-legged intersection.

Mitigation Timeframe

- Will the mitigations be constructed before the road connection? What is the timeframe for the mitigations?

Standard compliance for implementation of the mitigation measures is required. The timeframe for implementation of the mitigation measures is "Prior to the commencement of any grading activities or, if a grading permit is required, prior to the issuance of a grading permit to construct the road connection."

Improvement Costs – Questions asked but as of press time not answered.

- Will Sudberry Properties receive a credit and/or reimbursement for these improvements? If so, what is the amount and is it a DIF [Development Impact Fee] credit or reimbursement?

Year-round Mission Valley Farmers Market Saturdays in Civita Park 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The new year-round Mission Valley Farmers Market is now open every Saturday from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in Civita Park, 7960 Civita Blvd.

The market features 35+ vendors, including seven certified growers offering a wide variety of fruits, vegetables, and flowers. An array of specialty growers and producers offer exotic mushrooms, microgreens, honey, salsa, hummus, olive oil, vegan cheese, almonds, seafood, beef, eggs, chicken, baked goods, spices, teas, coconuts, Moroccan delicacies, kombucha, bakery items and more. Plus, there is live music every week.

In addition to abundant produce and specialty items, the Mission Valley Farmers Market features a wide variety of prepared foods for a convenient breakfast or lunch. There is a full-service coffee cart, plus cuisine from around the world, including crepes, tamales, sushi, and Thai, Filipino, and Indian dishes.

“We have about 35 vendors now and we will be growing to about 50 vendors in the next months,” said Ron LaChance, the market manager, who has been establishing and managing markets in San Diego County for 22 years.

“Civita Park is a unique venue for a farmers market, offering an amazing environment for the whole family,” he said. “The market is adjacent to the interactive 48-jet splash fountain, which is a magnet for little kids. Additionally, there are picnic tables, expansive lawns, playgrounds, and game areas surrounding the market. No other farmers market in San Diego County has access to such a beautiful amenity.”

LaChance says he is planning to add a “Makers Market,” featuring home-crafted items from local craftsmen, once a month and periodic blood drives.

Mission Village Drive: The city has plans to take our busy, highly traveled road from 4 lanes down to 2 lanes in Serra Mesa called MISSION VILLAGE.

The plan is to put in a buffered bike lane (so like a double line that adds about another foot or so in between cars and bikes). There will still be street parking and a center turn lane. Plus, at the top of the hill on Ronda, cars will need to suddenly MERGE ON A 40mph road from the two lanes into one lane! The city previously denied a motion by us, residents, to put a light by Ronda because of poor visibility, but then they want the cars to merge into one lane before you can even see over the Crest of the hill!

All of this with no community input at all. This will affect one of the only entrances into the neighborhood. They put in a last-minute notice to show up at the council meeting and no bother to inform the public. When asked about the 40 mph speed limit, they said it wouldn't be addressed at this time.

There are 100+ events planned at the soon-to-be Snapdragon Stadium, but only one lane in and out. The traffic study they are basing this on is six years old and doesn't include the impact of new condos, Civita, or SDSU WEST campus.
