

Our world is without one of our bright shining stars. Those of us who knew her immediately know the vacuum that exists without her. That is Bonnie Hough of course. Her presence was known immediately because of her influence in any discussion or conversation. Many do not know that she was a medical doctor with a doctorate in family medicine. I found Bonnie along with her crew working in our canyons cleaning out the invasive plants and replacing them with native specimens. She was active on our Serra Mesa Village Board making sure we had her input in assisting seniors staying in their homes.

She came upon her knowledge honestly as her dad

was a well-known horticulturist and took his family along as he traveled to Africa, Romania, Yugoslavia, and Czechoslovakia. Bonnie attended college in Puerto Rico and the United States, earning a doctorate in Family Medicine at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. In 1979 Bonnie was involved in a light plane crash which left her a paraplegic. After visiting San Diego for a medical conference, she made a permanent move to the area. After being introduced to a power-chair many of her barriers were removed.

Bonnie became a community activist for many social issues. One of her most active areas was in the environment. She introduced an appreciation of nature and native plants at Taft Middle School. She also found Friends of Ruffin Canyon which is active and growing today. Her Serra Mesa Home is on the canyon and filled with a variety of plants and animals. Her motto was if it did not smell good or could not be eaten than it could not stay there.

Good Bye Bonnie, we miss you. She is survived by her longtime partner Steven Byrd and her children Vryce (nee Emily) and Martha.



SERRA MESA PLANNING GROUP NEWS

The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library, 9505 Aero Drive. The next meetings are July 16 and August 20. To contact us, email smpg@serramesa.org.

SMPG's revised bylaws which were recently approved by the City Attorney's office increase the number of Board members to 15. With one vacancy and the approved increase in membership **SMPG has four board openings**. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two of the last six SMPG is eligible to be elected. Summary of May 21 Meeting (June 18 meeting cancelled - no agenda items)

Climate Action Plan – Passed a motion to send a letter to the Mayor and the City Council in support of the goals of the plan. The plan is at http://www.sandiego.gov/planning/genplan/cap/pdf/sd_cap_032515_draft.pdf.

Prioritizing Facilities Financing Projects – The outdated (some items have been completed) priority list at http://www.sandiego.gov/facilitiesfinancing/pdf/plans/smpffpfv.pdf_page 12. SMPG's voted to support the following items as top priorities (no order of preference):

- T7 Mission Village Drive sidewalks from Ronda to Qualcomm Stadium
- T10 Genesee Avenue Widening between the SR163
- P18 Community Center (conversion of current library)
- P5 Serra Mesa Community Park Recreation Building
- F1 Fire Station #28
- Ruffin Canyon Trail (not listed on the financing plan)

Additionally, SMPG doesn't support any of the Hickman Field items listed on the plan. This priority list has been given to City Councilmember Scott Sherman's office for his use. The official Facility Financing Plan isn't changed until there's a Serra Mesa Community Plan update, which isn't scheduled any time soon.

The Serra Mesa Community Plan, adopted in March 1977, is one of the oldest in the City which hasn't yet been updated. Serra Mesa doesn't score as high on the City's criteria list as our neighbors. Mission Valley is currently working on their update and Kearny Mesa is scheduled to begin their update.

Ruffin Road Improvement -SMPG voted to support sharrows on Ruffin Road.

Update

Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Franklin Ridge Road connection between Phyllis Place and Mission Valley won't be completed until late summer/early fall. If you're interested in this item, sign up to receive email notices at www.serramesa.org/. Once the draft EIR is completed, the public has 30 days to comment. The item will be scheduled for a SMPG meeting. If there is anyone who is an expert in environmental documents and willing to help with the review, please contact us at smpg@serramesa.org.

One Paseo –At the April 16 SMPG meeting the vote for a resolution to support opposition to One Paseo among eight of the 11 members present was 4 in favor, 3 against, and 1 abstention. The City's final determination: If there were 8 members of the SMPG present who were qualified to vote, and 1 member abstained, the quorum would remain a quorum of 8, and the simple majority of the quorum would equate to 5. Thus the vote did not pass.

Village News...\$4,000 Grant Received for Care Committee

The Serra Mesa Village continues to develop its vision of a "neighborly network of seniors for seniors". Each Village develops in response to its community. Most Villages (ours is this way) offer a combination of social activities, educational opportunities, and some form of "Care Committee" with the goal of having resources to help seniors meet their goal of staying in their homes as long as possible. The Village is a membership based organization, and the dues are \$25 per person per year.

The Serra Mesa Village will benefit from a \$4,000 "Edgar Grant" Gethsemane Lutheran Church received from Lutheran Social Services of Southern California. The Grant was awarded to help "jumpstart" the Care Committee of the Serra Mesa Village. The Village Board has not yet decided how to use this grant. A speaker from Jewish Family Services in May helped us understand how they work with seniors with increasing frailty, and in July, our speaker is from Elder-help. Since we have no Social Services Agency in Serra Mesa, we are leaning toward contracting with an existing agency. If you have ideas or want to be part of the Care Committee, email villageatserramesa@gmail.com or leave a message at the Community Council number, 858-565-2473 or come to a Board or General Membership Meeting.

When do we meet? The General Membership Meetings on the third Thursday of the month (July 16, August 20, and September 17 etc.) at the Library on Aero feature a speaker and a time to network and plan. The Board meets from 1-2:30pm on the 1st and 3rd Mondays in the Meeting Room at Gethsemane Lutheran Church (2696 Melbourne Drive). Those meetings are open to all. Games and conversation are available on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays afternoons again in the Meeting Room at Gethsemane. (Until we get a dedicated "Senior Center", we will need to borrow space.) An Excursion "somewhere in San Diego" happens on the 1st Thursday of the month. And last but not least, there is a Friendship Lunch at Mission Village Christian Fellowship (2650 Melbourne Drive) every Wednesday at noon which is sponsored by these two churches. There are plans to transition this meal to the Village...meanwhile, come and check it out...soup, bread, and a dessert. There is no charge but everyone is invited to bring a can or package of food for the Serra Mesa Food Pantry. If you have ideas or want to be part of the Village, email villageatserramesa@gmail.com or leave a message at the Community Council number, 858-565-2473.

So, exciting things are happening. While members are 55 and over, everyone who cares for seniors is invited to come.

Serra Mesa Enhancement Committee Update

The City asked the Serra Mesa Enhancement Committee (SMEC) to suspend activities in December 2014 until new code enforcement training is conducted with the volunteers. The May/June training mentioned in the last Observer edition was delayed. **Training will be scheduled sometime between mid-July and August.** If you are interested in receiving this training and becoming active with SMEC, write to P.O. Box 23315, San Diego, CA 92193 or send an email to serramesaenhancementcommittee@hotmail.com.

Focus: The focus of SMEC is information, education, cooperation and assistance in the area of code compliance. SMEC sends educational letters to residents requesting voluntary compliance in the areas of excessive weeds, miscellaneous storage, lawn parking, and other violations on an as needed basis. Many people are simply not aware of the codes, whose main purpose is to help keep the community looking nice, keep peace among its neighbors, and prevent nuisances in the neighborhood. SMEC makes referrals to Code Compliance as a last resort when the resident doesn't respond to our letters.

Composition: SMEC is composed of residents living in Serra Mesa (includes the Birdland area). SMEC volunteers are required to go to a City-sponsored training in order to be indemnified by the City. The amount of volunteer time varies with the volunteer from one hour a month to many.

Confidentiality: SMEC maintains the confidentiality of complainants, violators, and volunteers. SMEC members remain anonymous so the benefits of volunteering are intrinsic - the satisfaction of seeing improvements in the community and helping residents resolve community concerns.

Accomplishments: SMEC provides information through regular *Observer* columns. The efforts of SMEC have resulted in improvements in many residences in Serra Mesa and the resolution of community issues. The identity of SMEC cases is kept confidential.

A Hidden Treasure in Serra Mesa



This structure is the kids' redwood play house at the Serra Mesa Christian Fellowship Children's Community Playground. It's very attention-getting as you drive along Murray Ridge Road at Harjoan Avenue. Pastor Luis Juarez provided some of the details as to how this fun house came about: "I especially enjoy Yosemite National Park, and its many trees. That was inspiration for this project and two years ago we bought this redwood-style kids house as a to-assemble kit. The description suggested it could be assembled by one man and a helper in one day. Well, it didn't quite work that way for us – it took 3 general contractors (volunteers) and 10 of our church youth two 8-hour days to get it put together. The finished product gets lots of action. "

It is indeed memorable-looking and a fun house for exploring and climbing. The play area also includes a fountain, shade tree, and a basketball court (kid's size), which Pastor Juarez said is open for any community children to have fun with for free. The church is supportive of children in other ways, with an annual June rummage sale with all sales going to nearby Jones Elementary School. Lateral Lining Project Coming to Our Neighborhood

The Pipeline Rehabilitation J-2 (Laterals) Project is part of a program established by the City of San Diego and the Environmental Protection Agency mandating the rehabilitation of old and deteriorated sewer mains. The rehabilitation of existing sewer mains will improve the sewage collection systems within the different areas of the project. The project is located within all Council Districts. It is within the communities of Rancho Bernardo, Mira Mesa, Scripps/Miramar Ranch, La Jolla, Pacific Beach, University, Clairemont Mesa, Midway-Pacific Hwy, Peninsula, Linda Vista, Uptown, **Serra Mesa**, Balboa Park, Greater North Park, Southeastern San Diego, Southeastern, Navajo, College Area, Encanto Neighborhoods, Otay Mesa-Nestor, and San Ysidro. The project includes the rehabilitation of approximately 3,209 existing 4", 6" and 8" sewer laterals within the City's right of way utilizing **trenchless technology**. Access to rehabilitate the sewer laterals will be made through the existing manholes and cleanouts that are installed as part of the projects. Other related work entails external spot repairs to laterals as needed.

Residents may detect odor generation resulting from a material called resin used to solidify the lining that is installed along the walls of the existing sewer laterals. There is **no danger to residents and homes near the project area**. You will see construction crew members wearing personal protective gear, as required by the Occupational Safety and Health Organization (OSHA), to enter the manholes safely and prevent the inhaling of tiny filters resulting from construction activity inside the manholes. Residents near the construction area should not be concerned about exposure to these elements, as they are nowhere near the sewer pipe.

The installation of clean outs will require an excavation to uncover the lateral near the property line (see photo). There will be traffic control planned implemented by the Contractor as required, to protect everyone's safety within the project areas. The Contractor will also be directed to keep the area as clean as possible from dust and dirt at all times. Construction will be underway from Fall 2015 to Fall 2017*




