Like the rest of San Diego, I recently awoke to the tragic news that two of our Police Officers were shot and one, tragically killed.

I have a deep respect for our police force and recognize that the City of San Diego is blessed to have one of the best trained and most professional police department in the nation.

The brave men and women of SDPD leave their homes every day to protect us, not knowing whether they will come home to their families after their watch ends. Tragically, this was the case for the family of Officer Jonathan De Guzman.

Officer Deguzman protected San Diego for 16 years as a police officer, now it's our turn to support the family he has left behind.

The San Diego Police Officers Association is collecting money on behalf of the De Guzman family through their Widows & Orphans Fund.

It has been a great joy and an honor to bring a farmers market to Serra Mesa. From the initial idea that emerged in February 2015, to raising more than \$12,000 for the startup fund, and garnering 1,500+ Facebook likes, we have been so impressed by the community's enthusiasm and support! Then there was the grand opening on July 6, which attracted so many people that several vendors sold out of some products. Not only is it incredibly rewarding to finally have access to fresh produce nearby, it's wonderful seeing people at the market socialize with neighbors, support various community organizations such as the community council, the food pantry, and little league, and enjoy live music.



Overall, Market on the Mesa is doing well. Despite the intense heat and humidity of the last few weeks, people continue to steadily come out and shop and are helping the market find its equilibrium. But we face challenges that are common to most young farmers markets. In the last several years, farmers markets have proliferated and now there are more than 40 markets throughout San Diego County. This means that farmers, who have limited supply and staff, get to pick and choose which markets to sell at. Thus it makes sense that farmers will want to sell where they can earn the most return for their effort. We actually had to work very hard to convince farmers to join our market in the beginning, because they did not immediately see the potential here.

The general public is usually not aware of these behind-the-scenes issues that constrain markets, and sometimes shoppers will come to a farmers market and wonder why there aren't a larger variety of produce vendors. As a new market, and one in a relatively smaller community, we need to start with a fewer number of produce vendors and show there is enough demand for their products before we can add others. Therefore, time will tell whether Market on the Mesa can attract a greater variety of fruit and vegetable vendors. The power is in your hands (and wallet!) so come out regularly and show our produce vendors your love and support.
