I see lots of plans for the Mission Valley facility but only time will tell as we look forward to our ever-changing landscape. In the greatest city, I also think we live in one of the best neighborhoods in that city. We have all the makings of the best of all circumstances: proximity to the freeways, and for the most part quiet neighborhoods. If we have any problems, they are when we try to leave Serra Mesa. Once again, your Council has tried to contact the owners of these properties to ask them if there are any current plans. The answer is that the property is

owned by people who have inherited these properties and they are waiting for contamination issues as well as a healthy business climate. Once again, there is nothing we can do and your Council is looking for ideas to rectify the issue. Another issue we hear about is noise from Montgomery Field. We have several neighbors who would like the noise to be better regulated and controlled by directing air traffic over commercial areas. We would like to hear of these or other issues that impact our living conditions in Serra Mesa. There is a calendar telling you what events are going on as well as the ability to contact any of our service groups such as the Planning Committee, the Park & Rec group, friends of the library, and our Observer Newsletter. We also have a new monthly newspaper called the Serra Mesa Connection. You may have received it and if not you should be receiving it shortly as they broaden their delivery patterns. Either way you can stay up-to-date on what is going on. Remember that we have our General Meeting on the 4th Wednesday of every Month except July and December at the Serra Mesa/Kearny Mesa Library starting at 6:30PM.





Getting It Done

Reporting City Maintenance Problems

Get It Done is a City of San Diego mobile app that can be used to report non-emergency problem. Also, the app allows a resident to monitor the status of a reported case. Submission to Get It Done is easy and quick.

Process

- Download the app for a mobile device at https://www.sandiego.gov/get-it-done or submit problems online at https://getitdone.force.com/TSWNewReport
- Information requested for reporting a problem:
 - o Enter address
 - Report category/type: Select street light, traffic signal, storm drain, street flooded, illegal discharge, over irrigation, curb, damaged guardrail, faded striping, parking meter, pothole, sidewalk, street sweeping, traffic sign, abandoned vehicle, dead animal, graffiti, litter/dumping, other, or tree hazard
 - o Description
 - o Upload images
 - Can we contact you yes or no; if yes, the contact information (name, email address, phone number) that's entered is not visible to the public
- After clicking on Submit, a report number is provided. If an email address was entered, an email with the report information is sent.
- Status of Report Click on the link provided in the email or if an email wasn't sent, go to https://getitdone. force.com/TSWViewReportByList and find the report number. This site provides a lot of information. It shows the quantity of problems by categories. Also, by clicking on the Switch to Map View button, the status of problems in a geographic area can be viewed.

Code Violations

The focus of the Serra Mesa Enhancement Committee (SMEC), a community volunteer group, is information, education, cooperation and assistance in the area of code compliance. SMEC sends educational letters to residents requesting voluntary compliance in the areas of excessive weeds, plant growth on sidewalks, miscellaneous storage, lawn parking, and other violations on an as needed basis. Many people are simply not aware of the codes, whose main purpose is to help keep the community looking nice, keep peace among its neighbors, and prevent nuisances in the neighborhood. SMEC makes referrals to Code Compliance as a last resort when the resident doesn't respond to our letters.

Send any code compliance complaints (anonymously if preferred) that you would like SMEC to pursue or any ideas for articles to P.O. Box 23315, San Diego, CA 92193 or serramesaenhancementcommittee@hotmail.com.

Alternatively, code violations can be submitted directly to the City of San Diego by calling 619-236-5500 or filling out the form online at http://www.sandiego.gov/ced/report/investigation.shtml. You will be required to provide your name and contact information. This information is kept confidential.
