

The recent news of the fires at Lahainia on the island of Maui should make us all aware of how fast wildfire can attack a community. We often think of how that could not happen to us, but it is a possibility and we should make preparations with a "go kit" or some way of making sure we take those things we need on a last minute basis. What is most amazing is the "Aloha Spirit" that is taking place where neighbors are taking care of each other and meeting the needs of those who have lost everything. It is my hope and expectation that we would do the same for any of our neighbors who experience a situation of having a need where we would come to their aid. I would urge us to watch and learn from this experience as we never know what is in our future whether it be earthquake, fire, or some other disaster that we are not aware of.

The narrowing of Mission Village Drive has been completed between Ruffin Road and Ronda Ave. I would be interested in any comments on experiences by residents relative to the effect on their daily activities. So far it seems that people who live on Mission Village Drive find it easier to pull into and out of their property. The bicycle lanes give some added space to the parking area, and it seems to be helping residents to back out into the Drive. I try to avoid it during peak times so have no actual history of whether the traffic poses a serious problem. I have reviewed some comments on "Next Door" mostly from people who do not know how your Community Council opposed the narrowing and that it was the City Traffic Group who felt that it would be a safety matter. Please let us know on Next Door or better yet, come to our Serra Mesa Community Council Meeting on September 27th, at the Serra Mesa Library at 7:00PM. We will hear from our Community Officer on crime statistics as well as what happened to Annie, a homeless person who is deceased.

We, The Serra Mesa Community Council, would also like to hear your comments on our mayor's handling of our homeless issues. Like it or not, it seems that most cities are not doing what San Diego is doing as the problem continues to grow in our State and crime by the homeless increases.

Are you aware that we now have a new joint-use park at Taft Middle School? This area is available during non-school hours and there is a running track, pickleball and tennis courts, plenty of parking and a really nice though shadeless and marker less facility. You really must look for the driveway into the park at 9191 Gramercy Dr. The driveway is just past the school on Gramercy. You can access it on weekends or school days after school has been dismissed.

We remind everyone that our schools will be in session soon and to be sure and drive carefully and observe school hour speed limits. Remember, whenever children are present. Status of Airport Plaza Building – 8555 Aero Dr

According to the City's website permits have been issued:

- PMT-3162921 For demolition of the 3-story building at 8555 Aero Drive
- PMT-3158932 For construction of a 7-story above grade and 1-story below grade for 302 multifamily dwelling units and associated accessory uses.

The project will include affordable units and requests the affordable housing density bonus. This bonus allows more units to be built. The owner is listed as Crown Investments Co at Hotel Circle S. The project is located in the Kearny Mesa planning area.

SB 10 Update

The Planning Commission on August 3 voted to recommend approval of Housing Package 2.0 with the exception of SB 10. They recommended the formation of a working group on SB 10, which would allow public input. Implementation of SB 10 would greatly impact single family zoning (density, height, setbacks parking, etc.).

Housing Package 2.0 goes before the Land Use and Housing Committee on September 21. According to the Mayor's press release the package includes the following (paraphrased):

- A harmful land use, such as wrecking and dismantling motor vehicles, would no longer be allowed to continue after a transition period if it has been rezoned for homes or mixed-use development as part of a community plan update in the Promise Zone (https://www.sandiego.gov/economic-development/sdpromisezone).
- Allows the development of private, dorm-style student homes near transit and near universities and colleges.
- Encourages the creation of Single Room Occupancy homes with shared kitchens and bathrooms, particularly at the very low-income level.
- Promotes the preservation of affordable homes, to prevent residents from displacement caused by new development.
- Gives residential and commercial builders within a half-mile of a major existing or planned public transit stop the flexibility the ability to build the number of parking spaces they need.
- Encourage the development of Accessible Dwelling Units (ADUs) that are accessible for people with disabilities.
- Provides public agencies greater flexibility in developing homes on publicly owned land by increasing allowed densities and allowing affordable housing on premises zoned as commercial or residential.
- Remove barriers to constructing family homes, encourages the development of middle-income homes and allows for affordable homes to be located in areas with good job and school opportunities and a clean environment.

Some Serra Mesa residents concerned about the impacts of SB 10 posted signs in their yard. A statement from the Mayor's office indicates he will not be pushing for SB 10. As of press time staff hasn't removed SB 10 from Housing Package 2.0. For more information on Neighbors for a Better San Diego's effort to remove SB 10 go HERE.

Meetings: The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library, 9005 Aero Drive, and via online. To receive notices about meetings, which would include a link for the online meeting, sign up at http://www.serramesa.org/. Agendas posted at https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/profiles/serramesa/agendas. Next meeting: October 19. To contact us, email smpg@serramesa.org. Board: SMPG's bylaws allow fifteen Board members, two-year terms. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two SMPG meetings in the last six months is eligible to be elected. The City provides training. See https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources. Any qualified person interested in filling a board opening can be elected at a board meeting. Action Items, August 17th Meeting

Application for Community Planning Group Recognition, SMPG Subcommittee

All planning groups in the City are required to submit an application by December 31, 2023 to represent their community. The application form includes bylaws, a Participation and Representation Plan, and Ethical Standards.

Bylaws: To complete the bylaws the subcommittee requested input from the Board and community. On the following items the consensus was:

- Number of Voting Members 14 members: 2 members from each of the 6 elementary schools areas in Serra Mesa, one homeowner and one renter; a business representative; and a non-profit representative. If a position in a school area is unfilled, an eligible member outside of that area can be elected at-large.
- Justification Serra Mesa's neighborhoods differ in their needs and issues (e.g., stadium, Birdland, military, near 805, near apartments complexes, etc.) and representation from each of these areas helps Board members have a better understanding when making recommendations.
- Youth Representative One appointed position.
- Mail-In Ballots Not supported.


