



We started the year off with a District 7 Town Hall held at the Serra Mesa Library on Monday, January 29th. For those who attended, we got a state of the city report by Councilman Raul Campillo but the most productive was a question-answer period where many questions were answered. I got the feeling that our councilmember is trying his best to provide us with a safe and orderly community but as usual, the City is not able to resolve all of our issues. Two of the most pressing issues are the failure of the City Owned Montgomery Gibbs Executive Airport to get an unleaded aviation fuel tank installed. The importance of this is that as a training facility, many touch and go practice landings are conducted and tons of lead are spewed into our air that is dangerously close to our schools and recreation centers. Reports show that no amount of lead is acceptable and it causes issues with a young person's health. Waiting until 2025 just cannot be tolerated. The other issue that appeared was in the planned reduction of lanes on Gramercy Drive at Taft Middle School where traffic jams and double parking are causing traffic issues when children are dropped off and picked up after school. When the City Traffic Department was contacted by members of our Serra Mesa Planning group, it turns out that the director of the City Traffic Department had never been at the site to confirm the issues, he was also unwilling to meet with them to view the problems. Councilman Campillo promised that he would contact him and conduct an inspection. Here's hoping we can receive solutions quickly to these two issues.

Mesa Community Council (SMCC) has changed our meeting dates to the 4th Tuesday of January, March, May, and September. We are attempting to invite all of our elected officials so you can meet and discuss specific issues with them. We hope you will mark your calendars and attend these meetings. It is hoped that only having four (4) meetings per year will show that we respect your time and want to insure we use it wisely. At our January meeting we also elected four (4) new board members and they are: Alexia Longley, Carmen Ojeda, Joseph Konieczka, and Judi Mitchell. Welcome new board members and thank you for helping improve Serra Mesa.

Some good news is that funding for the easement for Ruffin Trail between Serra Mesa and Mission Valley is in place so soon we will have a completed trail to enjoy by Fall of 2024. This has been a long time coming and many I have talked to are anxious to hike this trail. Other good news is that our Serra Mesa Pantry is flourishing and if you are a Serra Mesa Resident, the pantry is open from 10AM – 1PM on Wednesdays at 2650 Melbourne Drive (across from Juarez Elementary School). The pantry is serving about 130 families per week and is a treasure of Serra Mesa. Because of the volume, you may be asked for identification showing that you reside in Serra Mesa. If you have citrus or garden surplus, you can donate during or just prior to opening and it will be welcomed and well received.



Projects & Other Information As Of February 2024

Serra Mesa Projects

Franklin Ridge Road Connection - Schedule for implementation of mitigations and road connection pending. Caltrans plans to redesign the Murray Ridge bridge to 4 travel lanes (11' wide) and 2 Class IV Bikeways (9' separated for each bikeway), construction possibly beginning in summer 2024. In October 2017 the City Council approved the mitigation of 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the bridge which differs from the Caltrans redesign. Also, other city-approved mitigations included 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for Phyllis Pl from the Franklin Ridge connection to the bridge, and 4 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the connection. The bridge redesign may impact the design of these mitigations.

Currently, inquiries have been submitted to City Councilmember Raul Campillo's office asking if the Caltrans bridge redesign will impact the design for the required Phyllis Pl mitigation and for the connection, and whether the changes in mitigation(s) will require subsequent environmental review and approval by the City Council.

Gramercy Drive Reconfiguration from Ruffin Rd to Mobley St - According to staff "As part of Slurry Group 2422 Gramercy Dr will be modified to include bicycle facilities per the Bicycle Master Plan. To achieve this gap connection, the number 2 lane will be repurposed as a bicycle lane. The current centerturn-lane, on-street parking spaces, and bus stops are being retained."

In October 2023 the Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter to the Mayor requesting that the community, Taft Middle School, and CityMark Development (owner of dirt lot) be invited to participate in discussion of the Gramercy Drive reconfiguration before a decision is made. The letter listed these concerns regarding school dismissal time: cars double parking in outer driving lane, illegal u-turns, students crossing in unsafe areas, and cars parking on the dirt lot (lot will become unavailable when construction begins). Safety was emphasized. The letter didn't receive a response.

City Councilmember Raul Campillo during his January 29, 2023 Serra Mesa Town Hall committed to a site visit and will invite the City's Transportation Department, SDPD, the school district, and community representatives.

AT&T Wireless Communication Facility, 2696 Melbourne Dr – 40' high tall faux eucalyptus tree; 12 antennas, 9 remote radio units; 300-foot ground level equipment enclosure, faux rock; located near labyrinth.

Mission Village Drive Properties owned by CityMark Development (purchased from Gleich Trust); zoned as a commercial zone that allows residential; qualifies for affordable density bonus; amenities minimal; rental rates not determined; Process 1 (staff approves project), waiting for approval.

2696 Mission Village Drive (former gas station near corner of Shawn Avenue): Build 3 story, 18-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms; rental units; 2 affordable housing units; 21 parking spaces.

3222 Mission Village Drive (former Tom Russell Chevron Station): Build 3 story, 21-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms on .96 acre; rental units; 2 affordable housing units; 23 parking spaces.

3241 Mission Village Drive (former medical building complex): Two sections - 4 story building, 35unit apartment building facing Mission Village Dr with 29 parking spaces and 3 story, 25-unit townhouses with 3 bedrooms and 2 car garages; exit on Ruffin Rd; still determining if townhouses will be rental units.

Former Guild Mortgage Building, 9160 Gramercy Dr – Vacant. For sale.

Former Mission Village Shopping Center, across from Taft Middle School, 9280 Gramercy Dr. Approval in 2004 for 160 rental units and 15,000 s.f. retail (8,000 s.f. along Ruffin Rd and 7,000 s.f. at Ruffin/Gramercy corner). In 2005 approval for condominiums, required to make the community room available to community at no cost, and condominium owners have an assigned parking space deeded to them. In 2007 never expiring Site Development Permit, Approval #57551, created for 9178 Gramercy Drive. Grading permit issued in 2006. San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board issued a notification of no further action on 1/20/2022. July 2022 - Clean-up equipment removed from site. Site for sale.

Old Serra Mesa Library on Sandrock – The City was proposing selling the property (.34 acre) for \$15,000 to Community HousingWorks for development of 60 Affordable Housing Units. The Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter in January 2024 expressing concerns regarding height (5 stories), the low sales price of \$15,000, and lack of parking (22 spaces). Project on hold.

Kearny Mesa Projects

Aero Project, 8225 Aero Drive – Former Kelco building, Sares Regis Group Residential is building 434 apartments (1, 2, & 3 bedroom units), 7 stories high, to be completed in 2024. Amenities include pool, spa, dog run, game courtyard, golf putting green, outdoor culinary kitchen, co-work space, conference room, clubhouse, fitness center, and bike repair room. More information can be found at the City's website, https://opendsd.sandiego.gov/web/approvals/, Project 692190 - DIGITAL-The Aero G &PI.

Airport Plaza Building, 8555 Aero Dr – Construction of 7-story above grade and 1-story below grade for 302 multifamily dwelling units and associated accessory uses. Project will include affordable units and requests an affordable housing bonus. (PMT-3158932).

Montgomery-Gibbs Airport – \$500,000 in budget for unleaded gas tank. Installation of the unleaded tank has been delayed for a couple of years. City staff decided to have the tank "designed and constructed" by the Capital Improvements Department instead of purchasing a "turn-key" ready tank that would have saved the city thousands of dollars, and could have been installed within 6 months.

City-Wide

Planning Group Changes – All planning groups were required to submit an application by December 31, 2023, to represent their respective community. The documents SMPG submitted are at <u>http://www.serramesa.org/smpg/documents/</u>.

ADU/JADU (Accessory Dwelling Units) – ADUs provide living area either detached or attached. Regulations – Encroachment into side and rear yards, no parking required; maximum size 1,200 s.f., rental term minimum 31 days, major fees waived, owner doesn't have to live in premises. Number of ADUs permitted on single family property based on TPA (area within ½ mile of existing or planned major transit stop). Could affect 748 acres in Serra Mesa.

Serra Mesa Planning Group News

Meetings: The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library, 9005 Aero Drive, and via online meetings. To receive notices about meetings, which would include a link for the online meeting, sign up at http://www.serramesa.org/. Next meetings: March 21 and April 18. To contact us, email smpg@serramesa.org.

Elections: SMPG's bylaws allow fifteen Board members. On March 21, 2023, SMPG will conduct an annual election for board members for two-year terms. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two SMPG meetings in the last six months is eligible to be elected. The City provides training. See <u>https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources</u>.

Current SMPG board members are Debra Burns, Ian Clampett, Kira Finkenberg (Secretary), Rochelle Freeman-Zuniga, Tony Guerra, Joe Ippolito, Sharon Kramer, Ken Maguire, Cindy Moore, Chris Rosemond (Vice-Chair), and Catherine Stempel (Chair). Board members termed out are Ian Clampett and Tony Guerra. Board members up for reelection are Joe Ippolito, Sharon Kramer, Ken Maguire, Cindy Moore, Chris Rosemond, and Cat Stempel.

Gramercy Reconfiguration, Action Item, January 18: Presentation made by City of San Diego Transportation Department on the reconfiguration of Gramercy Drive between Ruffin Road and Mobley Street to three lanes (two travel lanes and a middle turn lane) and bike lanes on both sides of the street. This results in the elimination of one travel lane in each direction. Safety concerns were discussed. A request for a traffic study and funding for a crosswalk was submitted to the City in January 2023. Motion passed to incorporate an updated drop off zone and fund the Beacon Hawk crosswalk for the safety of the kids and parents.

Balboa Park, Information Item, January 18: Peter Comiskey, Balboa Park Cultural Partnership, presented the Experience Plan for the Park. A plan is being developed to make it easier for visitors to experience all the park has to offer. Any community that would like to be involved can reach out to peter.comiskey@bpcp.org. Construction to begin end of next year, facility open 2027.

Friars Road WB Ramp and Mission Village Drive Concern: A city traffic engineer made the following report in mid-February, "Per evaluation, we have created work orders for Street Division to improve signage, striping, and pavement markings at Friars Rd off-ramp onto northbound Mission Village Dr. The "Yield" sign will be installed at the yield pavement markings for northbound traffic coming from the westbound Friars Rd off-ramp onto Mission Village Dr. Unfortunately, due to backlogs, we do not have an estimate of when these improvements will be completed."



Saga of Gramercy Drive Reconfiguration

At City Councilmember Raul Campillo's January Serra Mesa Town Hall residents shared concerns about the reconfiguration of Gramercy Drive between Ruffin Rd and Mobley St from 4 lanes to 2 traveling lanes, a middle turn lane, and 2 bike lanes. The concerns included illegal U-turns, double parking in the driving lanes, and kids crossing in unsafe areas on Gramercy during Taft Middle School dismissal time. A short video that demonstrated these issues was shown. Councilmember Campillo committed to a site visit along with inviting the City's Transportation Representative (who didn't visit the site prior to the reconfiguration decision), school representative, and а community representatives. It was confirmed with Campillo's office that projects were being put on hold while staff assisted in the flood recovery.

Additionally, a community representative informed the San Diego Unified School District Board Representative, Shana Hazan, who contacted the area superintendent. The superintendent indicated that if there was an impact, they would take a position. An update was never received.

On February 15, no parking construction zone signs were placed along Gramercy Dr, restricting parking on February 22-23. Contact was made with the pavement company, who confirmed that a slurry seal was planned. Contact was made with the Taft Middle School principal, who wasn't aware of the slurry seal and didn't know of any district plans for modifying the dismissal process to avoid issues. Contact was made with Campillo's office, who contacted Mayor Gloria's office. In October 2023 the Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter to the Mayor listing concerns and asking that a meeting with the school district, traffic engineer, and community be held before implementation. The Mayor's office never responded.

At press time Gramercy was being prepared for the slurry seal. Campillo's office has scheduled a February 29th site visit with a representative from his office, the school principal, Transportation Department Program Manager, SDPD Community Relations Officer, and community representatives.

What was the rush to implement a reconfiguration that placed students at greater risk? The condition of Gramercy Dr didn't require immediate attention. Why couldn't safety concerns at Taft Middle School be addressed first?

As preparations were being made throughout the city for month-long activities planned to celebrate Lunar New Year, the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library was first to kick off the festivities on Saturday, February 3rd.

Hundreds of families and neighbors arrived early to watch a stunning performance of Lion Dancers whose cultural ceremony provided a visual display that delighted the crowd. With drums pounding and festive music playing, ornamental dancers put on an enjoyable, acrobatic show.

Children had a chance to "Feed the Lion" donations believed to bring good luck to their households throughout the coming year.

After the event, the Library hosted a Book Faire giving visitors the opportunity to grab and carry as many items as they could pack in a large, provided bag for only \$5 with proceeds going to the Library. Included for sale along with many great novels to read were audio books and DVDs. It was the best deal in town.

Imaginative Library staff members held free craft classes allowing children to hand paint Chinese lanterns bringing fun-filled smiles to all.

Thanks to our new Librarian, Zeina Guorn, and her staff for putting on activities designed to delight all ages. Their hard work and creativity are appreciated. We look forward to Library events they may have planned for us in the future.

The Serra Mesa Community Council piloted a table at the Faire, helped with book sales, offered information to the community, and welcomed new neighbors. A good time was had by all.
