



## Drainage Issue at Southeast Corner of Sandrock & Aero Drive

#### Drainage Issue at Southeast Corner of Sandrock & Aero Drive

There are two issues regarding drainage at the southeast corner of Sandrock and Aero Drive:

**Infrastructure** – Since Aero Drive is in the Kearny Mesa Community Plan area, City Councilmember Chris Cate's office, District 6 representative in 2020, was contacted about the drainage issue during rainy weather. This was the response from the Stormwater Department:

"Based on our engineering assessment, the drainage and flooding issues are due to the lack of adequate storm drains in the area, which cause water to overtop the curb during rain events. This location will require a larger drainage study and additional engineering analysis; therefore, we will place this location on our needs list.

There are many critical repair and maintenance needs throughout the City, and we must balance available funds with those priorities. The needs list continues to grow, outpacing projected funding resources. In short, the best-case scenario for the work effort needed to design and install new infrastructure at this location is likely years away."

**Drainage from VA Building** – The photos in this article demonstrate the problem. Thanks to Miles Noel, City Councilmember Raul Campillo's representative, for his follow through when contacted in fall 2023. Here's the staff's response:

"Our Inspections staff have conducted three site visits for this issue since we last spoke: one on March 20th and two more recent visits on April 9th and April 10th. On March 20th, they observed a continuous flow of water from a curb cut leading to the street and observed water in the pump chamber of the onsite BMP when they opened the manhole cover. On April 9th and 10th, they met with the new maintenance contact and the hospital manager, and they conducted additional review of the BMP design and engineering plans and maintenance agreement.

Based on the information they gathered through sites visits, interviews, and research, our Inspections staff have determined that this BMP/detention basin was originally designed to hold rainwater during and shortly after a rain event, and then slowly pump this water out to the street to then drain away into the storm drain system. However, at some point, likely during construction of the onsite elevator, groundwater was encountered and appears to be making its way to the BMP's underground stormwater detention basin. Due to groundwater flooding of this basin, the pump is constantly running and discharging non-stormwater (groundwater) to the City's curb/gutter on Aero Drive. The accepted Stormwater Maintenance Agreement stipulates that this BMP is for "stormwater discharges only" and that all discharges should stop within a reasonable amount of time after the end of a rain event. The current groundwater discharge is not authorized under the Stormwater Maintenance Agreement unless there is an accepted NPDES Permit issued by the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board). The process to secure a NPDES Permit from the Regional Board will also require the City to accept any discharges as a stipulation of permit approval.

The next steps for the site are as follows:

- 1. The site must apply for NPDES Dewatering Permit from the Regional Board (30 Days Minimum).
- 2. If the permit is granted, the site will work with the City on potential solutions to remove run-off from the curb and gutter along Aero Drive (e.g. reuse water on-site, or connect to the existing storm drain without causing a public nuisance).
- 3. If the permit is denied, the site must stop discharging groundwater and instead reuse it on-site or divert the groundwater to the sewer. Diversion to the sewer will require an industrial discharge permit through PUD.

Additionally, in the meantime, the maintenance contact has installed a temporary diversion in the gutter to divert any water flow to the east away from the intersection of Aero Drive and Sandrock Road, where it has the potential to gather/pond since that intersection is at a low point with no nearby storm drain to carry the water away. The diverted flows now should travel east down Aero Drive to the closest storm drain inlet near the library located at 9005 Aero Drive. I will provide another update in approximately one month, to give the facility time to work with the Regional Board on obtaining a permit."



**Meetings**: The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library, 9005 Aero Drive, and via online meetings. To receive notices about meetings, which would include a link for the online meeting, sign up at <a href="http://www.serramesa.org/">http://www.serramesa.org/</a>. Next meetings: May 16 and June 20. To contact us, email smpg@serramesa.org.

**Elections**: SMPG's bylaws allow fifteen Board members. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person and who has attended two SMPG meetings in the last six months is eligible to be elected. The City provides training. See <u>https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources</u>.

## **Projects & Other Information As Of April 2024**

**Franklin Ridge Road Connection** – Schedule for implementation of mitigations and road connection pending. The developer recently submitted a design plan for 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the Murray Ridge bridge (the configuration that's described in the approved October 2017 plan). This differs from Caltrans' draft plan which describes the redesign of the Murray Ridge bridge as 4 travel lanes (11' wide) and 2 Class IV Bikeways (9' separated for each bikeway). Also, other city-approved mitigations include 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for Phyllis Pl from the Franklin Ridge connection to the bridge, and 4 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the connection.

**Gramercy Drive Reconfiguration from Ruffin Rd to Mobley St** – According to staff "As part of Slurry Group 2422 Gramercy Dr will be modified to include bicycle facilities per the Bicycle Master Plan. To achieve this gap connection, the number 2 lane will be repurposed as a bicycle lane. The current center-turn-lane, on-street parking spaces, and bus stops are being retained."

In October 2023 the Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter to the Mayor requesting that the community, Taft Middle School, and CityMark Development (owner of dirt lot) be invited to participate in discussion of the Gramercy Drive reconfiguration before a decision is made. The letter listed these concerns regarding school dismissal time: cars double parking in outer driving lane, illegal u-turns, students crossing in unsafe areas, and cars parking on the dirt lot (lot will become unavailable when construction begins). Safety was emphasized. The letter didn't receive a response.

City Councilmember Raul Campillo during his January 29, 2023, Serra Mesa Town Hall committed to a site visit. The site visit was held on February 29th with City Transportation representatives, Campillo's representative, school principal, and community representatives. The reconfiguration plan will continue.

**AT&T Wireless Communication Facility, 2696 Melbourne Dr** – 40' high tall faux eucalyptus tree; 12 antennas, 9 remote radio units; 300-foot ground level equipment enclosure, faux rock; located near labyrinth.

**Mission Village Drive Properties** owned by CityMark Development (purchased from Gleich Trust); zoned as a commercial zone that allows residential; qualifies for affordable density bonus; amenities minimal; rental rates not determined; Process 1 (staff approves project).

**2696 Mission Village Drive** (former gas station near corner of Shawn Avenue): Build 3 story, 18-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms; rental units; 2 affordable housing units; 21 parking spaces. Construction started.

**3222 Mission Village Drive** (former Tom Russell Chevron Station): Build 3 story, 21-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms on .96 acre; rental units; 2 affordable housing units; 23 parking spaces. Construction is anticipated to begin late spring 2024.

**3241 Mission Village Drive** (former medical building complex): Two sections – 4 story building, 35unit apartment building facing Mission Village Dr with 29 parking spaces and 3 story, 25-unit townhouses with 3 bedrooms and 2 car garages; exit on Ruffin Rd; still determining if townhouses will be rental units. Construction is anticipated to begin late spring 2024.

Former Guild Mortgage Building, 9160 Gramercy Dr – Vacant. For sale.

**Former Mission Village Shopping Center, across from Taft Middle School, 9280 Gramercy Dr.** Approval in 2004 for 160 rental units and 15,000 s.f. retail (8,000 s.f. along Ruffin Rd and 7,000 s.f. at Ruffin/Gramercy corner). In 2005 approval for condominiums, required to make the community room available to community at no cost, and condominium owners have an assigned parking space deeded to them. In 2007 never expiring Site Development Permit, Approval #57551, created for 9178 Gramercy Drive. Grading permit issued in 2006. San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board issued a notification of no further action on 1/20/2022. July 2022 - Clean-up equipment removed from site. Site for sale.

**Old Serra Mesa Library on Sandrock** – The City was proposing selling the property (.34 acre) for \$15,000 to Community HousingWorks for development of 60 Affordable Housing Units. The Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter in January 2024 expressing concerns regarding height (5 stories), the low sales price of \$15,000, and lack of parking (22 spaces). Project on hold.

#### **Kearny Mesa Projects**

**Aero Project, 8225 Aero Drive** – Former Kelco building, Sares Regis Group Residential is building 434 apartments (1, 2, & 3 bedroom units), 7 stories high, to be completed in 2024. Amenities include pool, spa, dog run, game courtyard, golf putting green, outdoor culinary kitchen, co-work space, conference room, clubhouse, fitness center, and bike repair room. More information can be found at the City's website, https://opendsd.sandiego.gov/web/approvals/, Project 692190 - DIGITAL-The Aero G &PI.

**Airport Plaza Building, 8555 Aero Dr** – Construction of 7-story above grade and 1-story below grade for 302 multifamily dwelling units and associated accessory uses. Project will include affordable units and requests an affordable housing bonus. (PMT-3158932).

**Montgomery-Gibbs Airport** – \$500,000 in budget for unleaded gas tank. Installation of the unleaded tank has been delayed for a couple of years. City staff decided to have the tank "designed and constructed" by the Capital Improvements Department instead of purchasing a "turn-key" ready tank that would have saved the city thousands of dollars, and could have been installed within 6 months.

#### **City-Wide**

**Planning Group Changes** – All planning groups were required to submit an application by December 31, 2023, to represent their respective community. The documents SMPG submitted are at <a href="http://www.serramesa.org/smpg/smpg-documents/">http://www.serramesa.org/smpg/smpg-documents/</a>. The City Council will make the decision in May (tentative) to certify planning groups.

**ADU/JADU** (Accessory Dwelling Units) – ADUs provide living area either detached or attached. Regulations – Encroachment into side and rear yards, no parking required; maximum size 1,200 s.f., rental term minimum 31 days, major fees waived, owner doesn't have to live in premises. Number of ADUs permitted on single family property based on TPA (area within ½ mile of existing or planned major transit stop). Could affect 748 acres in Serra Mesa.
