Meetings: The Serra Mesa Planning Group (SMPG) is officially recognized by the City and makes recommendations on land use issues to the City. SMPG meets the third Thursday of the month, 7 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa Library, 9005 Aero Drive, and via online meetings. To receive notices about meetings, which would include a link for the online meeting, sign up at http://www.serramesa.org/. Next meetings: July 18 and August 15. To contact us, email smpg@serramesa.org.

Elections: SMPG's bylaws allow fourteen Board members. Anyone who is at least 18 years old, affiliated with the community as a property owner, resident of Serra Mesa, or a local Serra Mesa business person is eligible. There isn't any requirement for prior meeting attendance. The City provides training. See https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/community/resources. To remain active SMPG is required by the City to maintain ten Board members. There are five openings and SMPG must fill one position. Please consider becoming a Board member.

The nine board members are Deborah Burns, Kira Finkenberg, Rochelle Freeman-Zuniga, Joe Ippolito, Sharon Kramer, Carrie Longley, Cindy Moore, Chris Rosemond (Vice-Chair), and Catharine Stempel (Chair).

Information from June Meeting


New Joint Use Facility at Jones Elementary School, 2751 Greyling Drive – Presentation made by representatives of Parks & Recreation, San Diego Unified School District, and architects.

- Project will include a natural grass multi-purpose field with walking track, drinking fountain, parking lot and fencing.
- ° Funding comes from Propositions S & Z, Measures YY & U, and Capital Improvement Bond Programs.*
- Estimated schedule General Develop Plan complete in Fall 2024, Construction Documents complete in Summer 2025, and open for use in 2028. Jones Elementary School will be undergoing whole site modernization.
- Public Input Process Project scheduled for SMPG vote on July 18 and will be heard by the Parks and Recreation Board in Fall 2024. On June 10 a school site meeting was held. Surrounding residents were invited to this meeting. As a result of the comments at this meeting the plan was updated.
- Joint Use Projects City of San Diego provides maintenance. Parks are open when school is not in session. Refer to https://www.sandiegounified.org/departments/real_estate_and_rentals/joint_use for Frequently Asked Questions and Concerns.
- Proposed Plan Modernization plan removes the portable buildings on northside of the school and adds a parking lot for use as a staff parking lot during school time. The current parking lot can be reconfigured for drop off and pick up.

Updates

Information provided by City staff via City Councilmember Raul Campillo's office on:

Property at 9280 Gramercy Dr – Location of One Hour Dry Cleaners in former shopping center site across from Taft Middle School:

The applicable permit is PRJ-1108858 which was issued on 05/14/2024. The permit allows for excavation and offsite disposal of approximately 1,200 cubic yards of chlorinated solvent impacted soils from the site subsurface.

Details of the work are posted on the gate at 9280 Gramercy Dr.

Drainage Issue at Corner of Aero/ Sandrock: The VA point of contact is currently working with the Water Board to obtain a dewatering permit. Additionally, they have contracted with an engineer to identify solutions to address the water flow coming from their property. Our Inspector also requested that they maintain their gutter daily to ensure that the temporary diversion that was installed to direct water flow away from the intersection continues to function.

Information from City Councilmember Raul Campillo's office on:

Repaving Aero & Gramercy:

- After residents reached out to our office regarding the quality of work done along Aero Drive,
 Councilmember Campillo spoke directly with the Transportation Department to evaluate the work being done.
- He is pleased to inform you that after working with the Transportation Department, City crews are scheduled to soon go out to your street to apply a slurry seal on top of the current surface, restoring your street to a familiar look and feel.
- Going forward, City staff will be using the Cape Seal method in place of the method initially used to repave your street. This new Cape Seal treatment consists of an initial application of asphalt emulsion followed by a layer of crushed rock. Finally, streets will receive a slurry seal, ensuring they are safe and smooth to drive on.

Projects & Other Information

(Current Late June 2024)

Serra Mesa Projects

Franklin Ridge Road Connection – Schedule for implementation of mitigations and road connection pending. The developer submitted a design plan for 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the Murray Ridge bridge (the configuration that's described in the approved October 2017 plan). This differs from Caltrans' draft plan which describes the redesign of the Murray Ridge bridge as 4 travel lanes (11' wide) and 2 Class IV Bikeways (9' separated for each bikeway). Also, other city-approved mitigations include 5 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for Phyllis Pl from the Franklin Ridge connection to the bridge, and 4 travel lanes and 2 bike lanes for the connection.

Gramercy Drive Reconfiguration from Ruffin Rd to Mobley St — According to City staff "As part of Slurry Group 2422 Gramercy Dr will be modified to include bicycle facilities per the Bicycle Master Plan. To achieve this gap connection, the number 2 lane will be repurposed as a bicycle lane. The current center-turn-lane, on-street parking spaces, and bus stops are being retained." AT&T Wireless Communication Facility, 2696 Melbourne Dr – 40' high tall faux eucalyptus tree; 12 antennas, 9 remote radio units; 300-foot ground level equipment enclosure, faux rock; located near labyrinth.

Mission Village Drive Properties owned by CityMark Development (purchased from Gleich Trust); zoned as a commercial zone that allows residential; qualifies for affordable density bonus; amenities minimal; rental rates not determined; Process 1 (staff approves project).

2696 Mission Village Drive (former gas station near corner of Shawn Avenue): Build 3 story, 18-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms; rental units; 2 affordable housing units built off-site; 24 parking spaces. Construction started. Plans at https://citymarkdevelopment.box.com/s/22hbebr8ble7xpfduomvijdicgdi5gz0.

3222 Mission Village Drive (former Tom Russell Chevron Station): Build 3 story, 21-unit apartment building with 1-2 bedrooms on .96 acre; rental units; 2 affordable housing units built off-site; 21 parking spaces. Exit on Mission Village Drive. Construction started. Plans at https://citymarkdevelopment.box.com/s/z1vvp1nhe4xjf2j3h823h5mjasw5yj5e.

3241 Mission Village Drive (former medical building complex): Two sections – 4 story building, 35-unit apartment building facing Mission Village Dr and 3 story, 25-unit townhouses with 3 bedrooms and 2 car garages; exit on Ruffin Rd; 92 parking spaces; still determining if townhouses will be rental units. Construction is anticipated to begin late summer 2024. Plans at https://citymarkdevelopment.box.com/s/1p564mqdb76pbwtusuq202p15kmpe4fr.

Former Guild Mortgage Building, 9160 Gramercy Dr – Vacant. For sale.

Former Mission Village Shopping Center, across from Taft Middle School, 9280 Gramercy Dr. Approval in 2004 for 160 rental units and 15,000 s.f. retail (8,000 s.f. along Ruffin Rd and 7,000 s.f. at Ruffin/Gramercy corner). In 2005 approval for condominiums, required to make the community room available to community at no cost, and condominium owners have an assigned parking space deeded to them. In 2007

never expiring Site Development Permit, Approval #57551, created for 9178 Gramercy Drive. Grading permit issued in 2006. San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board issued a notification of no further action on 1/20/2022. July 2022 - Clean-up equipment removed from site. Site for sale.

Work details for the site of a One Hour Dry Cleaners located in the former shopping center are posted on the gate at 9280 Gramercy Dr. Information:

The applicable permit is PRJ-1108858 which was issued on 05/14/2024. The permit allows for excavation and offsite disposal of approximately 1,200 cubic yards of chlorinated solvent impacted soils from the site subsurface.

Old Serra Mesa Library on Sandrock – The City was proposing selling the property (.34 acre) for \$15,000 to Community HousingWorks for development of 60 Affordable Housing Units. The Serra Mesa Planning Group sent a letter in January 2024 expressing concerns regarding height (5 stories), the low sales price of \$15,000, and lack of parking (22 spaces). Project on hold.

Kearny Mesa Projects/Issues

Aero Project, 8225 Aero Drive – Former Kelco building, Sares Regis Group Residential is building 434 apartments (1, 2, & 3 bedroom units), 7 stories high, to be completed in 2024. Amenities include pool, spa, dog run, game courtyard, golf putting green, outdoor culinary kitchen, co-work space, conference room, clubhouse, fitness center, and bike repair room. More information can be found at the City's website, https://opendsd.sandiego.gov/web/approvals/, Project 692190 - DIGITAL-The Aero G & PI.

Airport Plaza Building, 8555 Aero Dr – Construction of 7-story above grade and 1-story below grade for 302 multifamily dwelling units and associated accessory uses. Project will include affordable units and requests an affordable housing bonus. (PMT-3158932).

City-Wide

ADU/JADU (Accessory Dwelling Units) – ADUs provide living area either detached or attached. Regulations – Encroachment into side and rear yards, no parking required; maximum size 1,200 s.f., rental term minimum 31 days, major fees waived, owner doesn't have to live in premises. Number of ADUs permitted on single family property based on TPA (area within ½ mile of existing or planned major transit stop). Could affect 748 acres in Serra Mesa.

SMCC Bylaws Revision

On September 5, 2023, the Serra Mesa Community Council board passed the recommendation to revise the bylaws from ten general meetings to a minimum of four meetings per year. This bylaws change requires a vote at the general meeting on January 29, 5:45 pm, at the Serra Mesa-Kearny Mesa library.

5.5.1 Number of Meetings

The Board shall hold a minimum of ten regular monthly a minimum of four meetings per year, at a time and place set by the Board members and announced to the membership. Meetings may be cancelled by majority vote of the Board.
